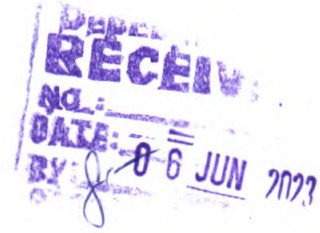

DCCCO Multipurpose Cooperative is the humble partner of the National Confederation of Cooperatives (NATCCO) Network in cascading Financial and Social Education to the students through the Aflatoun Program. Currently, the program is being implemented in the provinces of Negros Oriental, Negros Occidental, Siquijor, and Cebu with a total of ninety-nine (99) partner schools. The program is under the umbrella of DCCCO Youth Zone Laboratory Cooperative (DYZLC), a cooperative for children aged 7 to 17 years old which is under the guardianship of DCCCO Multipurpose Cooperative.

6. To provide knowledge of the nature of cooperative and the products, services, and programs of DCCCO and DYZLC.
